

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 1st day of Sept., A. D. 1902, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that

the Public Road leading from Adam Schock's residence to Fred Knarr's residence in said Township has been laid out for many years and open for public use. That that part of said road beginning at a point at G. V. Winger's house and ending at Fred Knarr's farm at his (residence) dwelling house and lying between the public road leading from Abraham Gallantine to Jacob Foudy and the public road leading from Schock's watering trough to Alvin Sugart, has become useless and burdensome and inconvenient and has been replaced by other public roads.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ^{3d} Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint T. C. Kirk, E. Schenfelter, C. H. Goodlander who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed

to view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been duly sworn, all the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the road to be vacated, and we do agree that there is occasion to vacate said public road as desired by the petitioners, and we do therefore vacate the following described public road, which by reason of having been supplied by other public roads in the vicinity has become useless; Beginning at a point in the public road leading from Galentined to Fourbys, thence north 52.5 ft. to a post, thence N. 53° 15' W., 289 ft. to a post, thence N. 41° 45' W., 106 ft. to a post, thence N. 48° 45' W. 127.5 ft. to a post, thence N. 4° 45' E., 200 ft. to a post, thence N. 10° 00' E., 1092 ft. to a point in the public road leading from Suthersburg to Alvin Burgets. That before said view, public notice, of the time and place of the meeting of said viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity, ten days before said meeting. That notice was served on the supervisors of Brady Twp., and on the owners of the land through which said road passes, and on the County Commissioners. That there are no damages resulting to any one of the owners of the land over which said road passes, by reason of vacating the same. We annex a plot or draft of said road vacated, stating the courses & distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes.

VIEWERS.

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
 Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
 Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


