

TO THE HONORABLE CYRUS GORDON, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

By virtue of a commission given the day of November A.D. 1903 appointing C.B. Alexander, Samuel Burge and Geo. Camel to view the bridge at Home Camp, Pa' recently built and constructed by the County of Clearfield across Anderson Creek, and to report whether said bridge has been properly constructed and if same should be be paid for as per contract, we the Inspectors present at view would respectfully report:

That we met at said bridge on Nov. 28, 1903. and being duly sworn or affirmed proceeded to carefully examine and measure said bridge, and found same to the best of our knowledge to measure up to the requirements, to have the required strength, and to be placed as per contract. All the parts of the bridge seem to be complete and properly fitted.

The undersigned Inspectors would therefore recommend that the bridge be accepted and paid for as contracted.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 5 day of May, A. D.

1807, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Monzon in said

County, setting forth that a bridge is

much needed, over Anderson
Creek at the place where the public highway leading from Horn Camp to Hiley Shaffers in said town crosses said Creek, the bridge now over said Creek at said point has become rotten and unsafe and a new bridge will have to be built with a span of about 50 feet in length and that the expense of erecting said bridge would be burdensome and more than it is reasonable for the inhabitants of said town and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court.

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Des B. Campbell, J. M. Wilson and
J. D. Burge

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any of them, view the same, and any of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

we find that a bridge
is needed at the crossing specifying in
this order and recommending the placing
of an iron bridge of duty foot span
(40) at same crossing of Anderson Creek
161 sixteen feet in width. as per plan
attached.

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.


