



We, the undersigned Viewers, Appointed by the  
within Order of Court, to View, and lay out the  
Road therein Mentioned. Respectfully report.  
That having given notice, of the time, and place  
of meeting, according to the act of assembly, and  
being all present at the view of the ground pro-  
posed for the said road; and being all sworn on  
affirmed, in pursuance of the said order of Court.

We have Viewed, and laid out, and do return the  
following road. VIZ. Beginning at a Post in the line  
between, Pike Township, and the Borough of Curwensville  
and run along a street, or alley south fifty nine and  
a half degrees west. Two hundred and ninety nine feet  
to a Post. Thence through land of Creighton, and Vorio  
Clark. South sixty Eight, and a half degrees west.  
Three hundred and one feet to a Hemlock. Thence in  
land of John Porter. South fifty nine degrees west.  
One hundred, and thirty five feet to a Post. Thence in  
land of the same, South Eighty degrees west fifty seven  
feet to a Post. Thence by the same. North Seventy west  
Seventy Eight feet to a Post. Thence still through land  
of the same, North forty three degrees west one hun-  
dred, and One foot to a Post. North forty one west  
seventy four feet to a Post. Thence North Twenty  
Seven and a half degrees west, One hundred &  
Three feet to a Post. Thence by the same North

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view <sup>and lay</sup> out the same according to law, <sup>and report to next term</sup> whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. T. McCloskey, Josiah Hartshorn & Jacob Bunge who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed <sup>View and</sup> ~~lay out~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
