At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20 day of Dec, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Giard, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of public road to commence at a point where what is known as the Knob road intersects the Old Clearfield and Kauffman road near what is known as the Bald Hill School House and to intersect with the new road built by the West Branch Valley Rail Road at or near the house of Isaiah Jurey.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{and} lay out the same according to law, ^{and} report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese, James Graham and E. S. Billotte who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report that after having given due public notice by three written and printed notices put up near the location of said road of the time and place of meeting to view and lay out the same and also having given due notice to the County Commissioners and Supervisors of Girard Township of said time and place of meeting we met at Bald Hill School house on Wednesday the eighth day of January A.D. 1902 at Ten O'clock Am and after having been duly sworn in pursuance of the within order we proceeded to view and lay out and do return for public use the following road to wit:
