At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20th day of December, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lizard

in said county, setting forth that a portion of the Old Road leading from Clearfield to Kaithaus, viz: between Surveyor Run and where the township road leading from the river intersects the above mentioned road is very steep, hard to keep up and an unnecessary burden on the taxpayers of said township, that a much better grade can be had for the same between said Surveyor Run and the intersection of the road leading from the river:-

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view Vacate Ed Supply the same according to law, Ed report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese, Ed Billotte Ed James Graham who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view Vacate Ed Supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

The Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Clearfield County Penna. We the undersigned
persons appointed by the within order of
Court to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned respectfully report that after having
given due public notices by three written and
printed notices put up near the location of said
road of the time and place of meeting to view
and lay out the same and also having given due
notice to the County Commissioners and Super-
visors of Girard Township of said time and
place of meeting we met at the point where
the old Clearfield and Karthaus road
crosses Surveyor Run on Thursday the 9th
day of January A.D. 1902 at ten o'clock A.M.
and after having been duly sworn in pursuance
of the within order we proceeded to view and
lay out and do return for public use the
following road to wit: Beginning at a point
in the Clearfield and Karthaus road near its
intersection with the road leading to the river
thence South seventy-eight degrees east two hundred
and sixty-seven feet thence South seventy-one degrees
east one hundred and forty-nine feet thence South
eighty degrees east two hundred and thirty-three feet
thence East one hundred and thirty-seven feet

Thence south eighty-five degrees east four hundred and twenty feet to a point in the Karthaus road on lands of Kyler Murray. Which said road as aforesaid laid out by us we are of opinion is necessary for a public road. We would further report that we are of opinion that the portion of the Karthaus road supplied by the above mentioned road also the part of said Karthaus road from its intersection with the road leading to the river to its intersection with the road leading to James Graham's. Also the part of said Clearfield and Karthaus road between a point about five hundred feet southwest of Bald Hill School House and the point where said road crosses Surveyor Run have become useless and burdensome to the tax payers of Girard Township and we therefore vacate the same.
