the within order of Court to view and lay out the
road therein mentioned, respectfully report that
we gave good and lawful notice of the said road view, and
being present on day appointed and having been severally
sworn or affirmed we have laid out and do return for
public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a

Place homestead, thence through improved land of

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22 day of Sept., A. D. 1902, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beell, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience ~~and disadvantage~~ for want of a public road or highway to lead from a point on the public road leading from McGee Mills to Pipersburg Pa. at a place known as the Solomon Place Homestead to a point on the Old State Road running from Curwensville to Saltsburg Pa. known as the Lumber Yard near the Jefferson County line.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~and lay out~~ the same according to law, ~~report to next term~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, John W. Bell and Geo. C. Conner who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~View and lay out the same~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

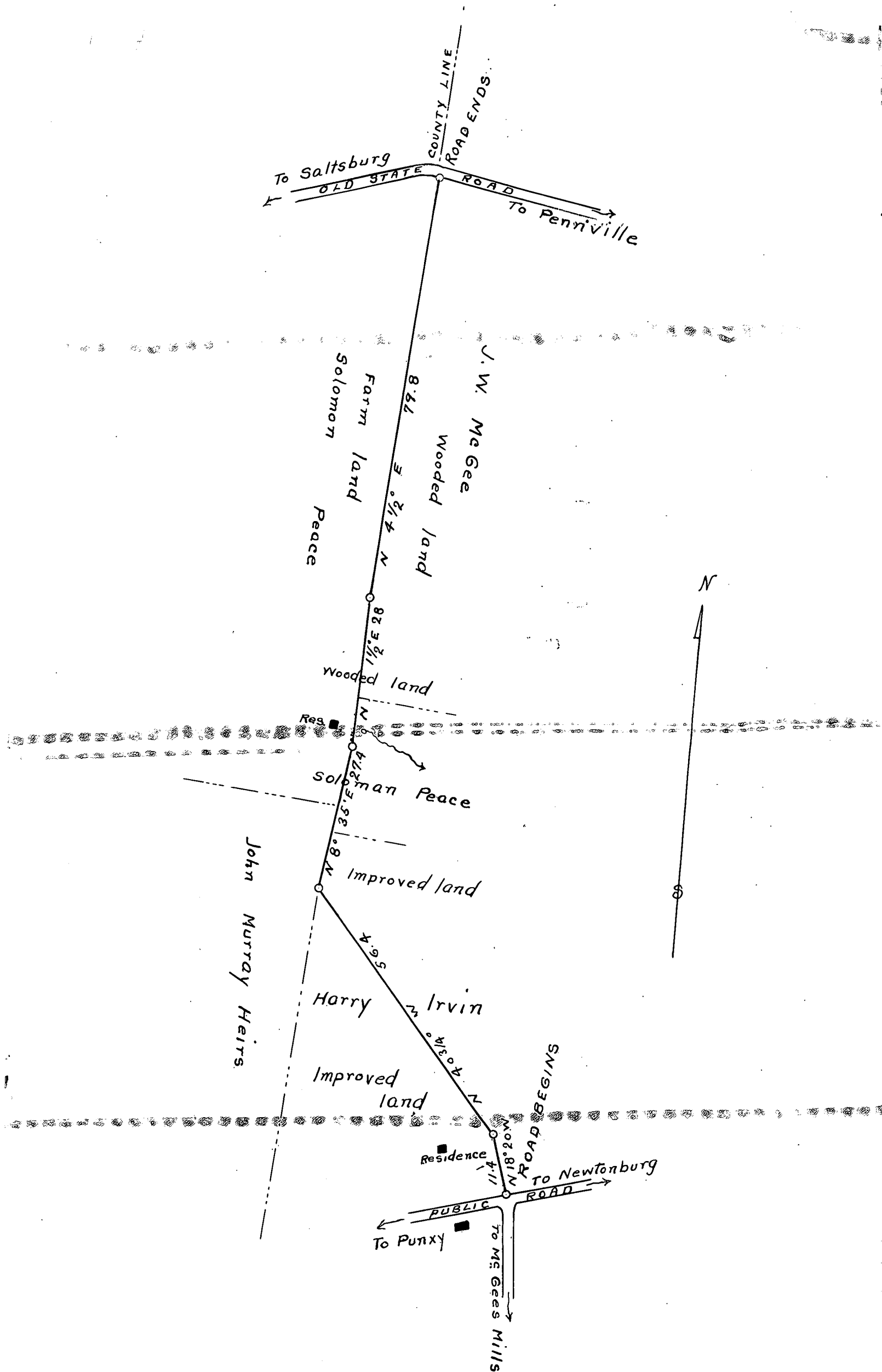
