IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY

To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon, President Judge of the said Court:

The undersigned, James H. Minds, The Supervisors of Bigler Township, and tax payers and residents of Bigler Township, file these exceptions to the confirmation of the report of the Viewers in No. 1 Sept. Term, 1903, recommending a public road as described in said report and proceedings to the No. and Sessions aforesaid:

First,-- No notice was given to the owners of seated land of the time and place of view, and James H. Minds did not have any knowledge of the time and place of view, although he is the owner of seated land through which the road as reported runs for about half a mile.

Second,-- While the report sets forth that releases were obtained or damages assessed for land taken, no releases are filed, and as appears by the record no damages have been assessed to the owner of any seated land through which the road as reported passes, and James H. Minds, exceptant, had neither notice of time and place of view, nor were any damages awarded to him, nor any consideration given the question of damages to him by the viewers, although he is the owner of seated land through which the road as reported passes for about half a mile.

Third,-- That the road as reported is wholly unnecessary and is not located so as to accommodate the people in the neighborhood or that section of the Township that might or could be accommodated with a public road, that its location is through a large swamp and marshy ground which will make its construction an extraordinary expense, and in view of the situation wholly unnecessary.

For all of which reasons, and others apparent upon the

face of the record, exceptants pray that the proceedings report of the viewers be set aside and the proceedings dismissed.

TO THE HONORABLE CYRUS GORDON, PRESIDENT JUDGE
OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY:

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of
Woodward and Bigler Townships, Clearfield County, Penn-
sylvania, respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience for
want of a public road or highway beginning at a point
where the public road leading from Brisbin to Jeffries
is intersected and crossed by the track of the Coal Run
Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad and about 100 feet
from the residence and vacated store room of Thomas K.
Henderson, Deceased, in Woodward Township, and ending
at a point in Bigler Township at a blazed oak stump near-
ly directly north of the intersection of the road lead-
ing from Madera to Mine Number Eighteen with the road
leading from Amesville to Mine Number Eighteen and near
Falcon Mine Number One-said blazed oak stump being a
witnessed monument on line dividing the Betts' and the
Minds' tracts of land and being eighteen feet from near-
est side of Township road leading from Amesville to Mine
Number Eighteen and seventy-seven feet directly north-
west from a chestnut tree on the northwest corner of
Bigler Dunlap's farm. The petitioners, therefore, pray
the Court to appoint three persons, qualified according
to law, to view the ground proposed for such road; and,

if they see occasion, lay out the same and make report
of their proceedings to the next term of the Court.

And they will ever pray.
