At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in, and for said county on the

12th day of Sept., A. D.

1903 before Judge of said Court upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Penn in said

County, setting forth that an Iron Bridge is much wanted over Curray Run, at the place where the public highway leading from Grassman to Pennsylvania crosses said Run, at the Old Bigler Cabin; the present wooden bridge being unsafe and unfit for travel; that the expense of erecting said bridge would be burdensome on the inhabitants of said Lwp and more than is reasonable they should bear.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. F. Mcloskey

James McKeown and Phineas Bloom

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report, the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.





7 given due and lawful notice of the time and place
8 of meeting of the Viewers by three or more advertisements
9 posted up in the most public places in the vicinity
10 of said view. And also having notified the Supervisors
11 of Penn Township and also the Commissioners of the
12 County of the same. We all met and after viewing
13 the premises. Report that we find the present
14 Bridge a wooden structure upon wooden abutments in
15 a very much decayed and dangerous condition. and
16 must even be replaced by a new one. or the Public travel
17 will be interrupted. And further believing that the
18 Expense of a new Bridge would be greater than the in-
19 habitants of said Township could reasonably bear. and
20 also that a Bridge at this point is necessary for the
21 Public travel. we would recommend that the County
22 build the same. And further would report that
23 in our opinion the Bridge should be an iron structure
24 placed on stone abutments. of a length between abutments
25 we think Thirty feet sufficient and ten feet high above
26 low water. with a road way of sixteen feet. The said Bridge
27 to be erected at the place where the present structure is. all of
