is much wanted over Curry run, at the place where the public highway leading from Grantman to Pumpsitawully crosses said Run, at the Old Bigler Dam; the present wooden bridge being unsafe and unfit for travel; that the expense of erecting said bridge would be burdensome on the inhabitants of said Twp and more than is reasonable they should bear.

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

We the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to view the site for a Bridge across Curry Run at the old Bigler dam in Penn Township. Do Report that after having first given due and lawful notice of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers by three or more advertisements posted up in the most public places in the vicinity of said view. And also having notified the Supervisors of Penn Township and also the Commissioners of the County of the same. We all met and after viewing the premises. Report that we find the present Bridge a wooden structure upon wooden abutments in a very much decayed and dangerous condition and must even be replaced by a new one or the Public travel will be interrupted. And further believing that the Expense of a new Bridge would be greater than the inhabitants of said Township could reasonably bear and also that a Bridge at this point is necessary for the Public travel we would recommend that the County build the same. And further would report that in our opinion the Bridge should be an Iron structure placed on stone abutments of a length between abutments we think thirty feet sufficient and ten feet high above low water with a road way of sixteen feet.
