



To the Honorable the Judge of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County -

We the undersigned - Viewers appointed
by the foregoing Order of Court to view the
Road therein described - Do Report -

that First having given due notice of the
Time and place of Meeting by Printed & written
Notices put up in the vicinity of said road
ten days before the time of meeting - and also
having given ^{legal} Notice to the owners and occupants
of land through which said road was intended
to pass - also to the Supervisors of said Township
and the principal petitioners asking for said
Road also to the County Commissioners of said
County we all met and being duly sworn
and affirmed proceeded to view the ground
of said proposed road - and after viewing the
the same we are of the opinion that the said
road is necessary. have thereupon laid out the
same by the following courses and distances.

Viz - Beginning at a Post in the Hickory bottom
Road where a untravelled road intersects the same
thence nearly along the same and through land of
Jacob Fulmer South five (5°) Degrees west fifty four
(54) Rods to line of H^r & Jacob Fulmer. thence through
land of the said H^r Fulmer south twenty degrees and
forty five minutes. (20°.45') west. sixty two and five
tenths (62.5) Rods to a Post on line of George Krollmann
thence along line of the same North eighty five degrees
and thirty minutes (85°.30') west. Nineteen and two
tenths (19.2) Rods to Post corner of Krollmanns land
and on line of H^r Elam Beams land - thence along
said line. South five degrees west (5°) thirty one

Half perches to Post of Krollmanns land - Then
through land of Mr. Elam Beam South forty one (41°)-
degrees west twenty seven (27) Perches to a Post - South
fifty four (54°) degrees west Thirty three (33) perches. —
Then - South thirty one (31°) degrees west thirty and three-
tenths (30.3) perches to line of Mr. Colome and Mrs. Miller
Then through Mrs. Miller's land - South thirty two (32°)
west thirteen and three tenths (13.3) Perches to line of
Mrs. Miller and Chas. Bechtol. and at eighteen and two
tenths (18.2) Perches a Post in land of Chas Bechtol - Then
still through land of Bechtol. South five (5°) degrees
west forty two and three tenths (42.3) Perches - South four-
teen (14°) degrees East Twenty and ~~two~~ ^{five} tenths (20.5)
and south $5\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East twenty and two tenths to a Post -



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 8 day of Nov, A. D. 1903, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper, in said county, setting forth that

a road hath been laid out by order of Court in the Township of Cooper, Clearfield Co., Pa., leading from public road leading from Myatt's to Cooper Settlement near the Daniels Beams farm or lane to the Hickory Bottom road near to the Jacob Beams meadow, if confirmed by the Court will be very injurious to your petitioners and burdensome to the inhabitants of the Township through which it passes

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and layout the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thos W. Moore, Alexander Shedd, A. Lansbury who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to Review the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC ~~or PRIVATE~~ road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

ORDER

To view and assess a road for public use in the township of Coal Creek, Clearfield County

Sept. Sessions, 1903; read and confirmed N. Si. Road to be opened 33 feet wide, except where there is side hill cutting or embankment and bridging, there to be 16 feet wider.

By the Compt. 12th Dec. 1903 Confirmed absolutely. By the court of Grant H. Thompson, clerk

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road. Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
