At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7th day of February, A. D. 1903, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

in said county, setting forth that your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for Public Road or highway to lead from Public Road leading from Daniels Beams farm or to lane to the Hickory Bottom near to the old Jacob Beam meadow.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese, Al. Dale, and Clark Hubler who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View and lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

**NOTE.**—In case of a private road, the release must be executed by the party for whom the right of way is granted.

Also.—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe that the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.





To the Honorable  
The Judge of the Court of Quarter  
Sessions of Clearfield County Penna:  
We the undersigned persons appointed  
by the within order of Court to view  
and lay out the road therein men-  
tioned respectfully report that  
After having given due public  
Notice by three written and printed  
Notices put up near the location of  
said road of the time and place of  
meeting to view and lay out the same  
and also having given due Notice  
to the County Commissioners of  
Clearfield County and the Supervisors  
of Cooper Township of said time and  
place of meeting we met at the  
point of beginning of said road near  
the house of Charles Brightol on mon-  
day the 6th day of April A.D. 1903 and  
after having been duly affirmed in  
pursuance of the within order we  
proceeded to view and lay out and  
do return for public use the following  
road to wit:

Beginning at a point  
in the public road running from  
Kylestown to Cooper Settlement at its

intersection with the lane running to the Daniel Beam house. Thence north nine degrees east three hundred and nineteen feet. Thence, north fourteen degrees west three hundred and fifty three feet. Thence north one degree east three hundred and ninety one feet. Thence, north four degrees east three hundred and forty three feet. Thence north twenty eight degrees east four hundred and twenty nine feet. Thence north forty three degrees east three hundred and fifty two feet. Thence North Forty Nine degrees East Nine hundred and thirteen feet. Thence north five degrees east two thousand four hundred and seventy five feet to a point in the public road leading to Sylvan Brook near the Jacob Beam meadow. Which said road as aforesaid laid out by us we are of opinion is necessary for a public road.
