To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cleaffield County,

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the township of Penn, county of Clearfield, and state of Pennsylvania, respectfully represent:-

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point on public road leading from the Lumber City and Grampian Road, by Leroy Widemire's and intersecting the Grampian and Curwensville road at Sbronach's-about one hundred and fifty feet south of the line between lands of E.A.Irvin and Mrs. Ida Walls, where said line intersects said road and to end at a post on the Grampian and Curwensville road, said post being about four hundred feet distant from the place of beginning and being north five degrees east from the place of proposed beginning, the whole of the said road being in the township of Penn, county of Clearfield, and state of Pennsylvania. The petitioners therefore pray the court to appoint three persons, qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for such road, and if they see occasion to lay out the same, to inquire of an vacate that part of the public road leading by the way of Grampian to Lumber City, lying between the place of beginning of the proposed road and the ending thereof which last mentioned part of said public road, will, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road, become useless; and to make report of their proceedings to the next court.

, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point on public road leading from the Lumber City rd Grampian Road by Leroy Wildenreis and intersecting the Grampian rd Curwensville Road at Stronach's about 100 feet South of the line between lands of C. A. Devin rd Mrs. Ida Walls, where said line intersects said road and to end on the Grampian rd Curwensville road, said point being 400 feet distant from the place of beginning and being North 5° East from the place of beginning, the whole of the proposed road being in the Township of Penn, Cleld Co. Pennsylvania. The petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to law to view the ground proposed for such road and if they see occasion to layout the same, to inquire of and locate that part of the public road leading by the way of Grampian to Lumber City lying between the place of beginning of the proposed road and the ending thereof, which last mentioned part of said public road, will by reason of the laying out of the same proposed road, become useless, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~located~~ ^{and} supply the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~Thomas W. Moore, Blair Read, and James Savage~~ who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~View the same and~~ Supply the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.




ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.
