



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, to view and vacate a portion of Public Road leading from Turkey Hill School House in Knox Twp. and ending near the house of Sam'l Shoff in Bigler Twp. that as claimed has become useless and burdensome to the inhabitants of Knox Twp. and is petitioned to be vacated from a point at or near the southern line of Abraham Walker farm in Knox Twp. Township, to a point where the private road of Calvin Snyder joins the same.

in Knox Township, in the county aforesaid, will meet at the house of Turkey Hill School House, in Knox Township, on Tuesday, the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D 1903, at 9 o'clock A. M., to attend to the duty assigned them, of which time and place aforesaid all parties interested will please take notice.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUAR-  
TER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to View, Vacate, and Supply for road therein described, Being duly affirmed do report that in pursuance of said appointment, after first having given due notice of the time and place of meeting as required by act of Assembly, we all met and viewed the original location of said road, and in our opinion no necessity exists for opening road on the old view as a good and acceptable road, hereinafter described, now and for many years has existed, taking the place without inconvenience or discomfort, of the original located road; We therefore would recommend the vacation of that part of the original road survey, as described in our instructions on first page of this report, on which no improvements now exist: Beginning at division line of farms of A.W.Walker and A.B.Owens, and continuing thence in a Southeasterly direction through farms of said A.B. Owens and J.P.Owens a distance of about 1800 feet to intersection with Public Road, adopted and now in use, at point on J.P.Owens' farm.

We further recommend in substitution for the original survey, that road improved and reported for the most part to have been in use for 23 years: Beginning at division line between A.W.Walker and A.B.Owen's properties and ending of Public Road now on original survey and leading through the A.W.Walker farm, thence through farm land of A.B.Owens S. 32 degrees and 30 minutes W. 140 feet to intersect with division line between properties of A.B.Owens and Isaac Wolf, and J.P.Owens and Isaac Wolf S. 33 degrees and 40 minutes E. 1488<sup>2</sup> feet to junction with Calvin Snyders' private road; Thence through farmland of J.P.Owens N. 86 degrees and 30 minutes 385.4 feet to junction of this road in present use with the location of the road by the original survey as before said.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 16 day of Sept., A.D. 1903, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Knob

, in said county, setting forth that

a portion of a public road long since laid out leading from Turkey Hill school house in Gordon and Knob Twp. and ending near the house of Samuel Shoff in ~~Bigler~~ Twp. has become useless and burdensome to the inhabitants of Knob Twp. and should be vacated from a point at or near the southern line of the Abram Walker farm to a point where the private road of Calvin Snyder joins the same.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~and Vacate~~ the same according to law, ~~Report to next term~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint O. B. Alexander, James Savage and Jacob Bunge who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~View and~~ ~~Vacate the same~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, ~~as may be~~, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of sealed land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


