The petition of the subscribers, citizens and taxpayers of the Township of Beccaria, respectfully set forth: That a petition has been circulated asking for the appointment of viewers to locate and lay out a Township Road in said Township of Beccaria beginning *Blain Run* *at its intersection with the line of Coalport Borough* at a point on the Public Road at Blain Run, near the Borough of *Beccaria* *and Beccaria Twp* *leading from* ~~Beccaria~~ to a point in the Public Road *near the* Village of Utahville. *To Coalport, opposite Isaac Heavly's blacksmith shop.*

Your petitioners desire to state that the said Road is entirely unnecessary and useless, for the reason that there are several other roads between the points mentioned; that the Township of Beccaria is now in debt to the amount of between <sup>9</sup>~~five~~ and <sup>10</sup>~~six~~ thousand dollars and that there are no available funds to build such a road if it should be laid out by Order of Court; that the said road if laid out will be burdensome on the taxpayers of the Township.
