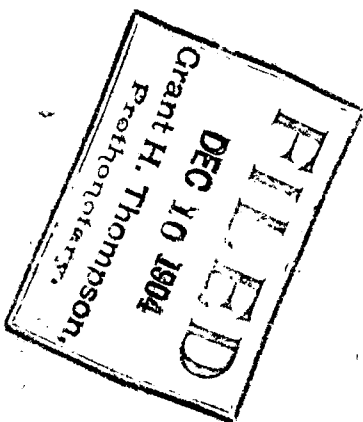

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14 day of May, A. D. 1903, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from a point in the highway leading from Sylestown to Cooper Settlement, at or near where Cross Flat road intersects with the same, to a point in public highway at or near Sylestown Pa.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and layout the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. B. Alexander, R. B. Mainer and Alex. Shields who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the undersigned viewers appointed to view and lay out the road herein mentioned, Respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said road view with notice to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County and Cooper Shop which notices are attested of kents, and having been severally sworn or affirmed we viewed and laid out and return for public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a point in the highway from Kylertown to Cooper Settlement near where the Grass field road intersects with the same thence by a private road and land N 58° 00' 00" W 100.45 feet through lands of James Pierce thence by same private road and land N 45° 00' 00" W 137.01 feet thence by same private road and land N 42° 30' 00" W four hundred eighty three and five tenths feet (483.5) to James and Abner Pierce line; thence by same private road and through lands of Abner Pierce N 83° 55' 00" W five hundred forty six and three tenths feet (546.3) to turn in road thence S 89° 40' 00" W two hundred one and eight tenths feet (201.8) to turn in road, thence by same S 64° 20' 00" W one hundred eighty six and two tenths (186.2) feet to turn in road about 25 feet from boundary line between James and Abner Pierce; thence by same private road S 58° 00' 00" W 215 feet through lands of Abner Pierce by same private road and continuing by same course and private road keeping boundary line between lands of James Pierce and Abner Pierce two hundred thirty five and five tenths (235.5) feet to line between lands of James Pierce and Jacob Wagner; thence N 86° 10' 00" W having private road and division line between lands of Abner Pierce and Jacob Wagner, six hundred and thirty feet (630) to boundary line between Jacob Wagner and James Pierce lands thence N 85° 15' 00" W by division line between lands of James Pierce and Abner Pierce two hundred thirty five and five tenths (235.5) feet to point on said division line. thence by old road N 23° 20' 00" W through lands of James Pierce two hundred twenty five and one tenth (225.1) feet to turn in road, thence by same old road and land N 44° 10' 00" W one hundred thirty two and two tenths (132.2) feet to turn in road, thence N 55° 45' 00" W by same old road and land thirty six feet (36) to boundary line between lands of James and Harry Pierce; thence by same course and through lands of Harry Pierce N 44° 30' 00" W three hundred and thirty five (335) feet to a post, thence through same lands N 72° 50' 00" W two hundred ten and five tenths (210.5) feet to a post, thence through same lands and by an old road N 40° 00' 00" W one hundred twenty eight and eight tenths (128.8) feet to a post, thence by same lands and old road N 61° 45' 00" W two hundred fifty five and five tenths (255.5) feet to a post at division line between lands of Harry Pierce and John Pierce; thence through lands of John Pierce N 89° 40' 00" W one hundred thirty eight and eight tenths (138.8) feet to a post, thence through same lands S 85° 15' 00" W eleven hundred thirty and four tenths (1130.4) feet to post on boundary line between properties of John Pierce and Harry Pierce; thence by a line between lands of John Pierce and Harry Pierce S 6° 30' 00" W three hundred thirty five and four tenths (335.4) feet to post, thence by same line and lands S 6° 00' 00" W three hundred thirty five and five tenths (335.5) feet to post; thence through lands of Harry Berg S 32° 30' 00" W one hundred forty one and five tenths (141.5) feet to post, thence by same lands S 38° 45' 00" W one hundred twenty five and eight tenths (125.8) feet to a post on boundary line between lands of Harry Berg and Peter Nelson; thence through lands of Peter Nelson S 43° 30' 00" W seven hundred sixty seven and five tenths (767.5) feet to post, thence through same lands S 58° 50' 00" W two hundred fifty four and five tenths (254.5) feet to division line between lands of Peter Nelson and Lyle Hoover; thence through lands of Lyle Hoover by the same course, S 58° 50' 00" W seven hundred sixty one (761) feet to a post; thence through lands of Lyle Hoover and by lands of E.
