



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18th day of May, A. D. 1903, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Shire

, in said county, setting forth that a road has long since been laid out for public use and been used in the said Township, which is a part of the public road leading past the residence of Fred J. Bloom to the Boro. of Curwenville. That by reason of the growth of the Boro. of Curwenville, the land along a part of the said road running through land formerly of Zachariah McNeil has become inconvenient and burdensome, and that a street have been laid out in that section, the road should be changed so as to make a less crooked road and to better accommodate the inhabitants and the public. That that portion of said road beginning at the point where said road intersects Bloom Street in the village of Marlton, to the point where said road crosses the line of land now or formerly of Fred J. Bloom is useless inconvenient and burdensome and should be supplied by another road.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view Vacate 3d Supply the same according to law, Report to next term 1903 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, James Savage 3d, J. N. Johnson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View Vacate 3d Supply the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, we the undersigned viewers appointed by the written order of Court to view, vacate and supply the road therein mentioned, respectfully report, that we have good and lawful notice of the said view and having been severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed the road which is proposed for vacation and the road to be supplied and find that the following road now in use to with beginning on road leading from Fred S. Bloom to Borough of Cressonville at Bloom Street in village of Moneton thence North one degree and twenty minutes East nine and sixty-three one hundredth Perches, thence Northwesterly two degrees thirty-seven minutes East twenty three and fifty-three hundredth perches to line of land of F. S. Bloom and Cressonville Water Co. formerly F. S. Bloom, has become useless inconvenient and burdensome and should therefore be vacated, and the following road, which we laid out to wit beginning at point at Bloom Street aforesaid thence through wooded land of Zechariah McPaul North thirteen degrees and twenty minutes East six ten and twelve-one hundredth perches to a post, thence through some North ~~minutes~~ and one half degrees East sixteen and sixty-two one hundredth feet to line of land of F. S. Bloom aforesaid at said road, which road as laid out aforesaid is necessary for a public road, A draft of the road as vacated and supplied is hereto annexed showing courses, distances and improvements, witness our hands this eleventh day of August AD 1903

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



The petition of John Shigley and Geo. Boyd
Supervisors of Lawrence Township - respectfully
represent that on June 2, 1902, the citizens of
Lawrence and Goshen townships, presented a
petition to said Court asking for Viewers to be
appointed to view, vacate and supply a public
road leading from a point in public road at
Lick Run Bridge to a point in public road at


