We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, respectfully report:

That we gave good and lawful notice of the said road-view and met agreeable thereto, and a viewer being absent, we adjourned to April 12, 1904, and were then all present and having been severally sworn or affirmed, we viewed the ground for the proposed road and are of opinion that a public road between the points named in the within order is unnecessary, and that there is no occasion for such road, there being already a good road between the said points. We believe that a public road is needed from starting point in within order to Colorado No. 3, but such a road would not reach more than one-third of the distance to Hawk Run named as the terminus in within order.



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 15 day of February, A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Morris, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from a point on the public road near Minion Station near Henry Herbert's property via the Public School House near Colorado No. 3 mine to a point on the public road near Shaw Run

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to next term, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Head A Jones and Jackson Slover who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to View and lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


