At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 24th day of February, A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

, in said county, setting forth that your petitioners labor under great inconveniences for want of a road or highway, to lead from a point in the public highway at or near the house of J. E. Thompson, to a point in the public highway leading from Winburne, Pa. at or near the house known as the Bigler Smeal shanty,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. H. Reese, Alex Shields and D. H. Waring who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View and lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.


Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.





The Judge of the

We the undersigned persons
appointed by the within order of Court
to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned respectfully report that
After having given due public
notice by three written and printed
notices put up near the location of
said road of the time and place of
Meeting to view and lay out the same
and also having given due notice
to the County Commissioners and
the Supervisors of Cooper Township
of said time and place of meeting
We met at the house of J. S. Thompson
in Cooper Township on Thursday the
Tenth day of March A.D. 1904 and after
having been duly affirmed in pur-
suance of the within order we proceeded
to view and layout and do return for
public use the following road to
wit. Beginning at a point in public
road running from Kylestown to
Grassflat and sixteen and one half feet
from corner of lands of Jas. L. Stewart

estate. Thence south four and one
fourth degrees west one thousand
three hundred and six feet. Thence
south fifty-two degrees east six hun-
dred and fourteen feet. Thence south
twenty-one degrees east two thousand
one hundred and seventy-two feet
Thence south nine degrees east three
hundred feet. Thence south forty
degrees east two hundred and fifty
one feet. Thence south fifty-four degrees
east one hundred and eighty-eight feet
Thence south twenty-nine degrees east
four hundred and thirty-nine feet
Thence south thirty degrees east five
hundred and forty-six feet. Thence south
forty-six degrees east seven hundred
and twenty-six feet. Thence south thirty
degrees east two hundred and five
feet. Thence south thirty-seven and
one half degrees east six hundred
and thirty-two feet to a point in the
public road running from
Winturne to Grassflat.

Which said
road so as aforesaid laid out by us
we are of opinion is necessary for

a public road.
