







*At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the fifth day of September, A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Knox, in said county, setting forth that*

that a portion of the Township Road leading from Olanta to Houtzdale, by reason of the laying out of the town of Boardman has become useless and burdensome to the said township they therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to view and vacate and supply that portion of the said road leading through the said village of Boardman.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate and supply the same according to law, and report to next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint E. W. Hess, James S. Read, and W. J. Hoffer, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate and supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



To the Hon. Allison O. Smith, P.J.

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed to view, vacate and supply, according to law, a portion of the Township Road leading from Olanta to Houtzdale, lying in the town of Boardman, Know Township, pray to report as follows: towit:-

That having given due and timely notice of said view according to law, to the Commissioners of the County; to the supervisor of the said Township; to the property holders adjacent the proposed change; and to the public by numerous notices posted at various points in the Township.

That on the 5th. day of November, 1904, the date set forth in notices, your viewers met on the ground at the place appointed, and having been affirmed according to law, evidence of which is attached; proceeded to view and survey the portion of road to be vacated, and to view and survey the portion of road to be supplied:- That we find by the erection of the numerous dwelling houses, stores, etc. of the town of Boardman and by the probable further erection of same, that the present road, as located does not serve the population living in the said town of Boardman, and that its present location is burdensome:-

That the new road as laid out by your Viewers will so serve said population, and meets with their approval, and your viewers could learn of no opposition to or remonstrance against the proposed vacating and supplying said road as petitioned:-

Therefore, your viewers would respectfully recommend the vacating of that portion of said public road lying in the town of Boardman, and described as follows:-

Beginning at a pine stump in the edge of the driveway, 650 feet northeasterly from the "Cox Barn", and running thence the following course and distances:-

S. 39 1/2°E-----300 feet to post,

Thence S. 20 1/2°E-----350 feet to post,

Thence S. 1°E-----400 feet to post,

Thence S. 15 1/2°E-----268 feet to post,

Thence S. 44°E-----118 feet to post in road opposite the south end of a log stable.

And, furthermore, your viewers would recommend the supplying of the following described public road, as being on a fair grade, the distance not excessive, and the expense of building not large, there being no clearing or grubbing to be done, the ground smooth and but one small culvert to be built:-

Beginning at the same point as for the road to be vacated;)

Thence S. 43°E-----296 feet to post,

Thence S. 37°E-----513 feet to post, in new road surveyed July 19th. 1904, and reported favorably, and running thence to as far as said new road extends, and farther,

S. 53°W-----392 feet to post

Thence S. 35°E-----403 feet to post,

Thence S. 35°E-----139 feet to post, described as end of road to be vacated, being 1743 feet in length, or, excepting the part above referred to as surveyed July 19th. 1904, 1493 feet to be built.

A blue print map showing said roads, vacated and supplied, is herewith attached and made a part of this report.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road. Also.—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
