AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF  
BRADFORD TOWNSHIP, CLEARFIELD COUNTY,  
PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING HOOVER'S ROAD, TOWNSHIP  
ROAD 220.

The Board of Supervisors of Bradford Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the authority granted in 53 P.S. § 66101, et seq. as amended, enacts and ordains as follows:

Section I  
DECLARATION OF PURPOSE

Section 1.01: It is hereby declared that Hoover's Road, Township Road 220, is no longer necessary for access by the general public and it no longer serves its intended use. The Board of Supervisors has determined that Hoover's Road is inconvenient and burdensome to the Township. The road is presently used primarily by persons who dump trash and garbage alongside the roadway and onto private property adjoining the roadway. Vacating the road will protect the health and safety of the public and prevent future dumping. Further, Hoover's Road provides no access to any other roadways; therefore, vacating the road would not inconvenience the public or interfere with traffic patterns. The Board of Supervisors has determined that it is necessary to vacate the roadway as hereinafter described.

Section II  
VACATE HOOVER'S ROAD, TOWNSHIP ROAD 220

Section 2.01: Hoover's Road, Township Road 220, originating from the intersection of State Route 1012 (Legislative Route 17054), to its terminus, a distance of approximately .35 miles, which is more fully depicted on the diagram attached hereto as Exhibit "A", is hereby vacated.

Section III  
SEVERABILITY

Section 3.01: In the event that any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance, it being the intent that such remainder shall remain in full force and effect.



Section IV

Section 4.01: This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after the date of enactment.




