Dear Ms. McCracken:

Pursuant to the provisions of 75 Pa. C.S. Chapter 92, TRANSFER OF STATE HIGHWAYS, the portion of the following State Route located in Goshen Township is hereby deleted from the State System.

HEREIN INCLUDED:

SR 1007 (LR 17154) from segment 0010 offset 0000 (station 0+00) to segment 0030 offset 0642 (station 58+08), a distance of 5,813 feet or 1.1009 miles.

This action is taken with the concurrence of the Township as evidenced in the attached Resolution No. 97:4.

As of December 31, 1997, the responsibility for maintenance, construction and reconstruction of the portion of highway described above reverts to the Township. This portion of highway will not be placed on the Township's mileage system for Liquid Fuels Tax Reimbursement under Act 655 of 1956, for April 1, 1998; however, beginning on April 1, 1999, annual payments will be made in the amount of \$2,750.00 under 75 Pa. C.S. 9511(g). This amount is based on the \$2500 per lineal mile payable under provisions of the Department's Highway Transfer Program.

The Engineering District 2-0 Highway Turnback Coordinator will provide the Township with copies of the straight-line diagrams, all available right-of-way information, and will be happy to furnish any personal assistance needed.


