road in said Township; That viewers were appointed and
proceedings regularly had, and report of viewers filed to May
Sessions 1905, at which Sessions, the report of said viewers
was confirmed *ni si*. That subsequent thereto, and before
the record was made up, the report of viewers in some way
disappeared from the records and files of the office of the
Clerk of said County. That your petitioners have caused






