At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14 day of Nov. A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Northaus

, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a public road to lead from a point near George Gross' Coal Mine in the Twp of Northaus to a point near William Askeys in the same Twp.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to Dec. 1. 1904 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. B. Alexander W. J. Hoffer and Jacob Burge who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and said road agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT
OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned viewers appointed to view for the public road herein mentioned, respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view as per accepted notices herewith attached and by notices posted according to law.

On the 1st. day of December as set forth in the notices served, your viewer met as appointed and being duly sworn or affirmed proceeded to view for said road.

Your viewers would respectfully report that they found covering the entire distance for which the public road has been petitioned (about 2 1/3 miles) a private road in good condition which is the only outlet of a number of farms and the only road to the Mt. Carmel school house.

This road lays on high dry ground and has a good grade. It should require little expense to open it for the public use and should be easy to keep in repair. No objections were offered on the day of the view to the opening of this road. Your viewers would therefore respectfully recommend that the road be granted.
