The undersigned, Girard Kasubick, Solicitor, and Mary Ann Albright, Secretary, of Brisbin Borough, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, hereby gives Notice that the Borough of Brisbin, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania vacated a portion of Oak Alley in said borough between Swoope Street and Otter Alley being twenty (20') feet in width and one hundred fifty (150') feet in length by Borough Ordinance No. 2010- 02 duly adopted on December 6, 2010. The undersigned Secretary hereby certifies that a true and correct copy of the original Ordinance filed in the Borough Ordinance Book is attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A". The vacated portion of said alley is no longer opened to the public and the alley hereby reverts to the adjoining landowners.

ORDINANCE NO. *2010-02*

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF OAK ALLEY IN THE BOROUGH OF BRISBIN, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

WHEREAS, the general public and citizens of the Borough of Brisbin no longer use a certain portion of Oak Alley, and the Borough no longer maintains this portion of road for travel.

BE IT ORDAINED, ENACTED AND ADOPTED by the Council of Brisbin Borough, County of Clearfield, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1: This Ordinance shall be known as the "Ordinance Vacating a Portion of Oak Alley".

SECTION 2: The Borough of Brisbin, Clearfield County, hereby vacates a portion of Oak Alley described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point where the southern line of Swoope Street intersects with the eastern line of Oak Alley; thence running in a southwesterly direction along the eastern line of Oak Alley approximately One Hundred Fifty (150') feet to the northern line of Otter Alley; thence along the northern line of Otter Alley in a northwesterly direction approximately Twenty (20') feet to the western line of Oak Alley; thence along the western line of Oak Alley in a northeasterly direction approximately One Hundred Fifty (150') feet to the southern line of Swoope Street; thence along the southern line of Swoope Street in a southeasterly direction approximately Twenty (20') feet to point and place of beginning as shown on the County Assessment Map of said Borough, the vacated area shaded in red on the map attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A".

SECTION 3: Any and all ordinances or resolutions or portion or parts of ordinances or resolutions inconsistent with or conflicting with this Ordinance of the Borough of

Brisbin are hereby repealed to the extent they conflict with this Ordinance.


SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be effective forty (40) days from the enactment hereof under the provisions of Section 1741 of the Borough Code.


