OF QUARTERSSESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY:-

To the Honorable Allison O. Smith,

President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions
Of the County of Clearfield,

The undersigned Viewers,--appointed by your Honorable Court by the attached Order to view and vacate that portion of a Public Township Road, located in Geulich Township, Clearfield County aforesaid, beginning at the point of intersection with the Township Road leading from Ramey Borough to Ginter Settlement at the Joseph McCullough Farm to the post where said Road crosses the Township line between Woodward and Geulich Townships, near the William Earle Farm,--respectfully report:

That in pursuance of our appointment, as aforesaid, we gave Notice by posting, for a period of at least ten (10) days, four (4) printed hand-bills at the most public places in said Geulich Township, and along the line of the Road to be vacated; that we also caused a copy of said View to be made to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County, as well as to each of the Supervisors of Gulich Township.

That in pursuance of said Notice, and in accordance therewith, we met at the Ginter Post Office, in Geulich Township, on the sixteenth (16th) day of January, A. D. 1905, and after each of us having been duly sworn according to law, we proceeded to view that portion of the Township Road hereinbefore described and set forth in the "Order to View" hereto attached. That the Supervisors of Geulich Township, viz: Jacob Copenhaver and William M. Korman, were present and in attendance upon said View. That after going over the entire line of said Road, as prayed for to be vacated, we unanimously decided and agreed that said portion of said Public Road had

been useless and burdensome upon the Township to keep in repairs. That the necessity, which called for said Road as originally laid out, had long since ceased to exist. That as a highway, the same has become useless.

We, therefore, Report that we have vacated that certain portion of the aforesaid Road set forth in the plot or draft hereto attached, viz:

Beginning at the point of intersection with the Township Road leading from Ramey Borough to Ginter Settlement at the Joseph McCullough Farm, thence North nine (9) degrees, East three hundred and ninety (390) feet to a point; thence North sixteen and one-half (16-1/2) degrees, East two hundred and eight (208) feet to a point; thence North twenty (20) degrees, East five hundred (500) feet to a point; thence North thirty-eight (38) degrees, East one hundred and eighty-five (185) feet to a point; thence North fifty-two (52) degrees, East one thousand (1,000) feet to a point; thence North ten (10) degrees, East two hundred and sixty-four (264) feet to a point; thence North nine (9) degrees, East three hundred (300) feet to a point; thence North six (6) degrees, East two hundred and ninety-eight (298) feet to a point; thence North thirty-one (31) degrees, East three hundred (300) feet to a point; thence North forty-four (44) degrees, East four hundred and eleven (411) feet to a point; thence North sixty (60) degrees, East three hundred (300) feet to a point; thence North sixty (60) degrees, East three hundred and twelve (312) feet to a point; thence North forty-eight (48) degrees, East three hundred (300) feet to a point; thence North thirty (30) degrees, East two hundred and sixty-six (266) feet to a point; thence North twenty (20) degrees, East three hundred (300)


feet to a point; thence North twenty (20) degrees, East one hundred (100) feet to a point; thence North thirty-two (32) degrees, East one hundred (100) feet to a point; thence North twenty-six (26) degrees, thirty (30) minutes, East four hundred and sixty-two (462) feet to a point; thence North thirty (30) degrees, thirty (30) minutes, East six hundred (600) feet to post, where said Road crosses the Township line between Woodward and Guelich Townships, near the William Earle Farm.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 29 day of Nov, A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Gulich

, in said county, setting forth that a portion of a public township road located in Gulich Twp. beginning at the point of the section with the township road leading from Rooney Borough to Linter Settlement at the Joseph McCully farm to the point where said road crosses the Township line between Woodward and Gulich Township near the William Eailo farm, has become useless and burdensome for the citizens of Gulich Twp. to keep up and in repair.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and Vacate the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Dunn, Alex Stewart & Harry Ribling who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to View and Vacate the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
