
We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order, do report, that in pursuance thereof after having been severally duly sworn or affirmed, all the viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road. And we the undersigned, do agree that there is occasion for a road, as described by the petition, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect for the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road to wit. Beginning at a point in the Borough line of DuBois at station, No 2-36 the same being two hundred and thirty six feet (236) from the centre of Locust Street in DuBois. Pa. Thence south twenty five degrees east (S 25- E) five hundred and sixty four feet (564) to a point in the Public Road leading from Pifer-Hess and Cos. Planing Mill to Dixon Ave. a total distance being five hundred and sixty four feet (564) We further report that before said view, public notice was put up at the beginning and terminous of view, We hereto annex a plot or draft of said road as laid out stating course and distance, There are improvements on this line.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. B. Campbell, A. H. Dunlap & Geo. Lankard who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
