

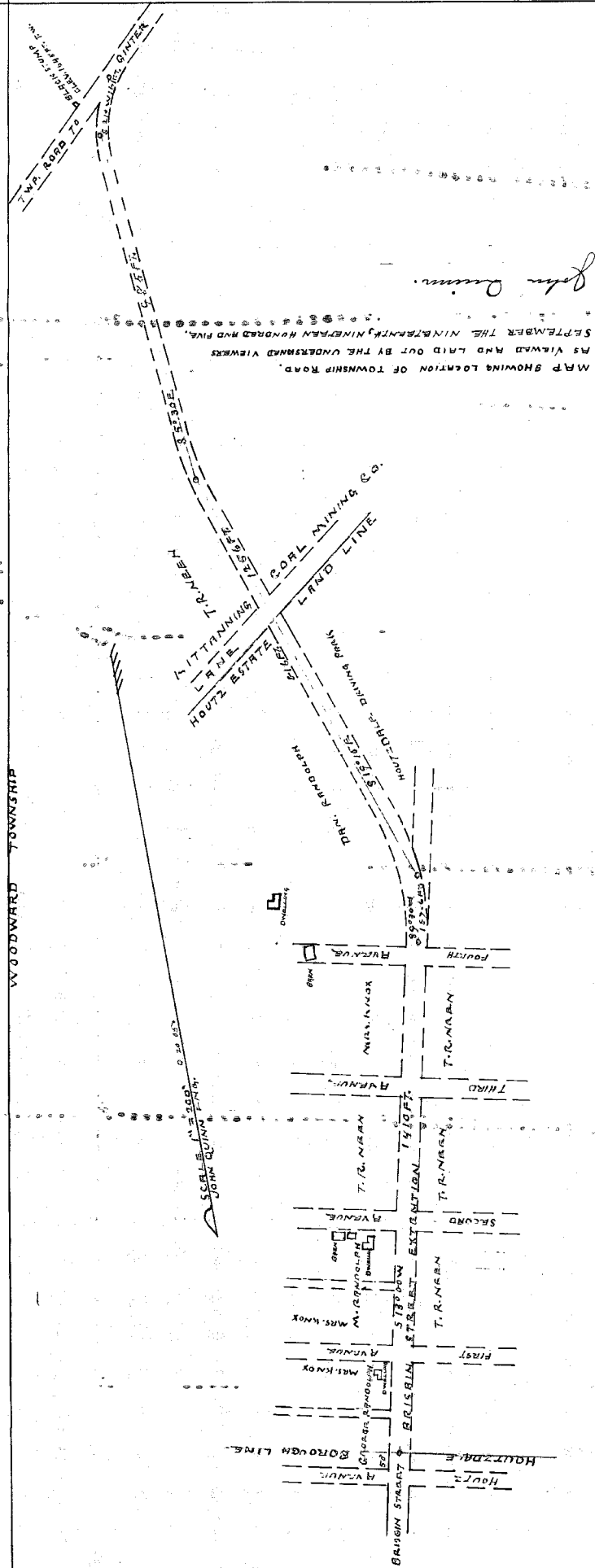

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 5

day of Sept, A. D. 1905, before the

Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Woodward

, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point at the southern terminus of British St. Hazledale Boro at the line of Woodward Twp and extending to a point in said Twp 22.50 ft. south of the south line of land of Thomas R. Kier at or near a stump marked by U. S. Government survey (station 1645) in a public road leading from Hazledale to Ginter

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{a layout} the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Quinn, Wm. McTiggart, Jacob Pitman

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ^a to view ^a lay out the same

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

HONORABLE ALVISON O. SMITH, JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS.

We, the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view and lay out a road therein mentioned, respectfully report; that we gave notice of the day and time of our meeting to the County Commissioners, as well as to the Supervisor of Woodward Township, and the owners of the land through which the proposed land passes; that we also gave public notice of the time and place of our meeting, by posting hand bills in public places, in the said Township, according to law; that on the 19th. day of September A.D. 1905, the undersigned viewers, viz: John Quinn, William McTarrant, and Jacob Ritchman, after having duly sworn according to law, to perform the duties of our appointment, impartially ^{and with fidelity} and according to the best of our judgment, in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed and laid out, and do return for public use the following road, to wit: Beginning at the line of the Borough of Houtzdale and running South thirteen degrees, West by the improved lands of George Randolph and Mrs. Christina Knox, and dwelling house of Mrs. Knox, continuing by the dwelling house and improved lands of M. Randolph and the improved land of Thomas R. Heen and said Mrs. Christina Knox, four hundred and ten feet to a post, said course being an extension of Prison Street, granted for the public use by Houtz Heins; thence by the improved lands and dwelling house of Daniel Randolph, south nine degrees, thirty minutes West, one hundred and eighty seven and six tenths feet to a post; thence by improved lands of Daniel Randolph, and Houtzdale Driving Park, crossing a lane dividing lands of Kittaning coal company and Houtz Estate, and running by improved land of Thomas R. Heen, South nineteen degrees, fifteen minutes East, twelve hundred and fifty six feet to a post; thence through unimproved wood land of Kittaning to a post, by, South five degrees, thirty minutes East, nine hundred and eighty five feet to a post; thence through said land, south twenty one degrees West, one hundred and sixty one feet to a post in the centre of Township road leading from Houtzdale to Ginter, at or near a black stump marked 1645; the plot or draft thereof is herewith annexed.
