At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7 day of Dec., A. D. 1904, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Morris

, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in said Twp. commencing at a point on the public road leading through Hawk Run village at or near residence of John M. Powell to a point on the bank of Moshannon Creek where the public road in Rush Twp. runs through to the bank of Moshannon Creek in the Village of Lake Lamond Mill in Centre Co. Penna. and to connect with the terminus of said road in Rush Twp. on the opposite side of the Creek

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view *and lay out* the same according to law, *Report to Sept. term* whereupon the Court, upon due consideration ^{had of the premises}, do order and appoint *C. B. Alexander, W. E. Gearhart, Frank Goss* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed *view and lay out the same* agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

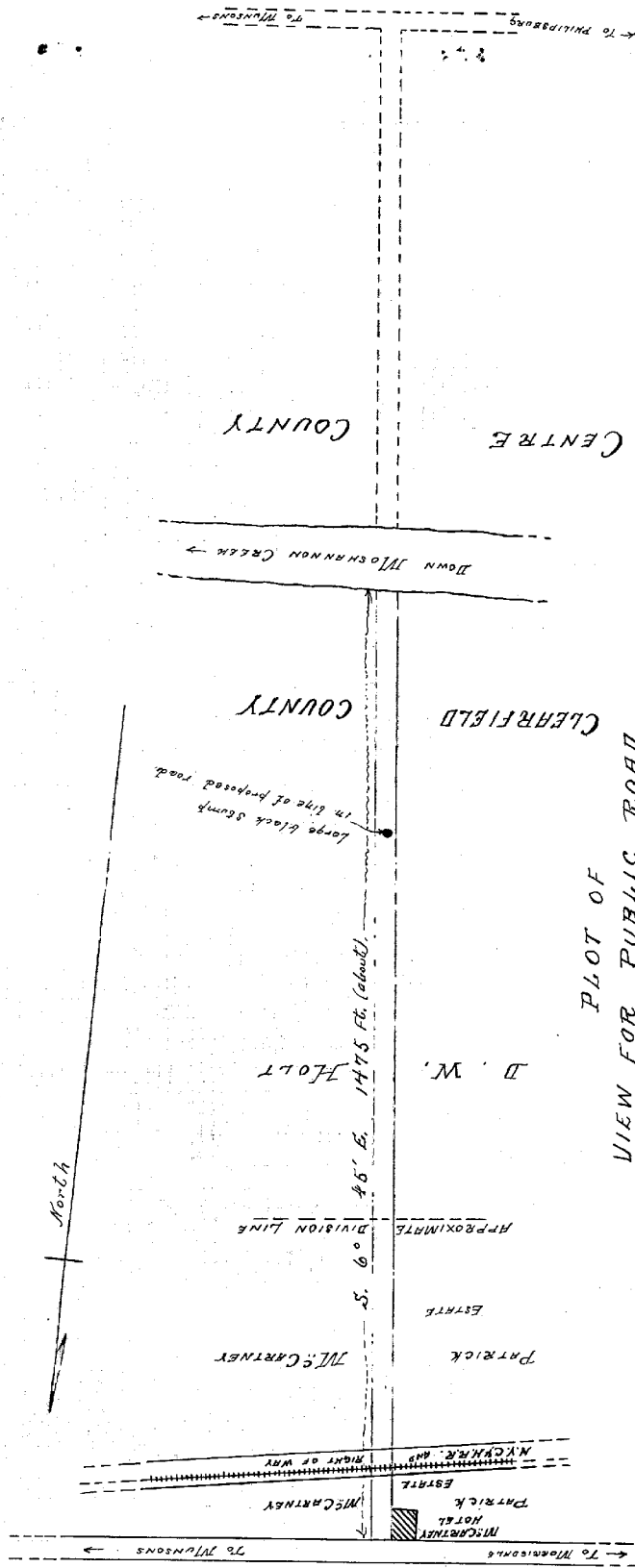

TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned Viewers for public road herein mentioned, respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County, to the Supervisors of Morris Twp. to property owners along route of said view, and notices were posted in the vicinity of view all according to law. Copies of notices with signatures are herewith attached.

On August 7th. 1905 as per notices given your viewers met as appointed and being severally affirmed, proceeded to receive testimony and to view for public road as herein mentioned.

Your Viewers have found that this road as desired by the petitioners will have to be built on swamp land for almost its entire length and will further require a bridge over the Moshannon Creek of about 100 feet span, which should be built jointly with Centre County, if the road is opened. However your viewers have learned that a number of new mines are being developed on the Centre County side of Moshannon Creek and that most of the prospective workmen live in the vicinity of Hawk Run on the Clearfield County side of this stream.

The piece of road as laid out on the Clearfield County side of this stream will be about 1475 ft. long, and with the Centre County end completed will be approximately 1/2 mile long to connection with a public road in Rush Township, Centre County and leading from Philipsburg to Munsons, the connection being near the new mine openings.

It is estimated that this half mile of road will save a travel distance of from four to five miles to the citizens of Hawk Run and vicinity who wish to go to and from these new mining developments.

This proposed road will also shorten the travel distance between Philipsburg and Hawk Run and also between Philipsburg and Munsons.

The best location for this road was decided upon as beginning at a point on the public road leading through Hawk Run by McCartney's Hotel, a short distance from the residence of John McDowell and running from thence directly S. 6 degrees and 0 minutes E. 1475 feet (about) to the bank of Moshannon Creek, the division line between Clearfield and Centre Counties.

No opposition was offered to this road at time of view. It is much desired by the citizens of Hawk Run and Vicinity, and will be very much needed when the new mines are in operation, your viewers would therefore respectfully recommend that it be built in conjunction with a road on the Centre County side of the stream to connect with other public roads of Centre County.

Your Viewers would further respectfully suggest that the matter of building this road and necessary bridge over the Moshannon Creek be taken up with the proper authorities of Centre County before proceeding with the construction of this road in Clearfield County.

A map of this road is herewith attached and made a part of this report.
