In Re Public Road in Bradford Township, NO. 3 Feb, Sess, 1903.

To the Honorable Allison O. Smith, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned, citizens and taxpayers of Bradford Township respectfully represents:- That the road as viewed and laid out in this case is not necessary for the accommodation of the public, as there is already a road running parallel most of the way and the opening and maintaining of an additional road would be a great hardship on the township which is now taxed to the full extent to maintain the roads which are now opened. Your petitioners further state that the road in question would be used by but a few citizens and that those citizens now have a road which answers very well. Wherefore, your petitioners showing that the road is not needed they would respectfully ask the court to appoint three disinterested persons who are not residents of that vicinity to review the road and make report to the court.

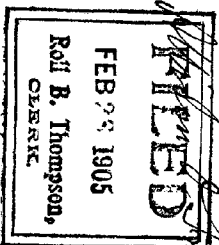

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

there has long since been laid out a public road in said Township. Beginning at a point on the Snowshoe & Packville Turnpike at or near Borritt Station and extending to a point in a public road at or near the house of Cyrus Kephart's leading from Egypt Settlement to the village of Grahampton in Graham Twp. and that same in its present location has become inconvenient and would better accommodate the traveling public by being changed so as to begin and end at the same points but to be changed from Cyrus Kephart's place to the Martin Wilson Estate

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view *and locate* *and supply* the same according to law, *Report to May* whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *Geo. C. Kirk, J. S. McQuinn, Peter Moyer* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed *View & locate* *and supply* agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plat or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
