who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any two of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.



TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT
OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned viewers for Public Bridge herein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view to the County Commissioners of Clearfield county, to the Street Commissioner of Osceola Boro., and notices were posted in vicinity of view, all according to law. Copies of said notices with signatures are herewith attached.

On Monday the 23rd day of October, A.D. 1905 your viewers met as appointed, and being severally affirmed, proceeded to receive testimony and view for said bridge.

Your Viewers would respectfully report:-

1st. The location selected for the proposed bridge ~~is~~ not now in connection with a public road or street on the Centre County side of the stream.

2nd. The proposed bridge spanning Moshannon Creek which divides Clearfield from Centre County, should from the nature of its location be constructed jointly by the aforesaid Counties. Your Viewers have been informed that Centre County has refused this bridge or at least postponed action in regard to it.

3rd. It does not appear to your Viewers that at present there is sufficient need of a highway bridge at this point to warrant Clearfield County in incurring the expense of such construction.

A draft showing the location of this proposed bridge is herewith attached and made a part of this report.
