At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 2 day of Oct., A. D. 1905, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road, on the East side of the Winburne branch of the New York Central & Hudson River Railroad, to lead from a point at or near the lower Winburne School House to the crossing at the New York Central & Hudson River Railroad station,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. B. Alexander, John W. Howe, Leander Scammon who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned Viewers for Public Road herein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County, to the Supervisors of Cooper Township, to the property holders along route of said view, and notices were posted in the vicinity of view, all according to law. Copies of said notices with signatures are herewith attached.

On Monday, October 23rd. A.D., 1905, your Viewers met as appointed and being severally affirmed, proceeded to receive testimony and to view for Public Road as herein mentioned.

Your Viewers would respectfully report that:-

1st. This proposed road seems desirable because a number of citizens living along its proposed location have no convenient public outlet.

2nd. It provides a convenient and desirable change of location for the proposed new state road to be built in this section. The location of the present public road on the opposite side of the ravine, while necessary in its location for the convenience of ~~of~~ citizens living thereon, is undesirable for much traffic because of the travel being interfered with by several railroad crossings and a trolley line.

3rd. No damages are asked for necessary roadway and Mr. John W. Dahl, one of the property holders benefitted has agreed to assist without cost in the drainage of swampy portions of the proposed road.

4th. All township officials and citizens present at time of view were in favor of this road being granted.

Your viewers would therefore respectfully recommend that this road be granted beginning at <sup>a point in</sup> ~~a bend of~~ the present Public Road near the lower Winburne School House and running thence N. 17-35 W. 1129.5 ft. to a point in Terrace Avenue, Thence by said Avenue N. 3-00 E. 820.5 ft. to a point on the N.Y.C. & H.R.R.R. crossing and junction with present public road and including a right of way of 16.5 ft. on each side of this given centre line.

A plot or draft of this proposed road and location is attached herewith and made a part of this report.


