TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, President judge, of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the the County of Clearfield.

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitant of the Township of Woodward, in the said County, respectfully sheweth: That your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public Road or Highway, in the Township of Woodward, to begin at a point at the southern terminus of Brisbin Street, at the Houtzdale Borough line in Woodward Township, and extending thence to a point, at the Northeastern corner of land of Thomas Neen in said Township, in a public road leading from Houtzdale to Ginter.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the public road, according to law; and they will ever pray, &c.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the  
county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clear-  
field, in and for said county, on the 13  
day of July, A. D. 1905, before the  
Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry  
inhabitants of the township of Woodward  
in said county, setting forth that

*your petitioners labor under great inconvenience  
for want of a Public Road or Highway, in Woodward  
Twp. to begin at a point at the Southern terminus  
of Brisbane Street, at the Nantydale Borough  
line in Woodward Twp. and extending thence  
to a point at the Northeastern corner of land  
of Thomas Neen in said Township, in a  
public road leading from Nantydale to  
Ginter.*

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view *and  
lay out* the same according to law, *Report to next term*  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and  
appoint *John Reim, Wm M Taggart Jacob Rietman*  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their  
appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed  
for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers  
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed *to view  
and lay out same* agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be,  
having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in  
such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particu-  
larly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE  
road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances  
and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also pro-  
cure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass,  
or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and  
shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for  
said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and  
affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or  
occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of  
the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

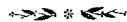

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
