

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 21st day of Sept^t, A. D.

1863, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bowersdale in said

County, setting forth that a bridge is very much needed over the Susquehanna River at a point a short distance above the Breast of the old dam formerly the property of George Hatch in Bowersdale Twp.

For many years a bridge has been maintained immediately below the Breast of said dam partly by public spirited individuals and partly by the Twp. The building and keeping up repair of this bridge in this manner has always been quite burdensome. Your petitioners believe the fact that 3rd of the money between Johnstown & Curwensville is sufficient evidence of the necessity of a bridge that this Court

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Harry Myers, Wm. Naffer and James Savage

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any 2nd of them, view the same, and any 2nd of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.

the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pa we the
undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of court
to view the bridge herein mentioned respectfully report
that we gave notice of the said Bridge view, and being
generally sworn or affirmed we viewed the location for
the bridge and find that a bridge has been maintained
at Langdon Mill but said bridge is now gone except foot
logs spanning the river, And whereas the roads leading to
the West end of said Bridge are along the river bank on low
ground overflowed by floods, and each leads to a railroad cross
ing within half a mile, with no person living between
said railroad and the bridge, and Whereas the bridge is lo-
cated at the point named in the within order (as pointed out) would
merely connect the roads on each side aforesaid and be an
unfavorable location for a public road crossing to be built over the
said railroad, and whereas the building of the said railroad on the
West Side of the river this year has changed conditions so
that now it is safer to travel the road on the East bank of
river to Cherrytree, and whereas the road from the bridge
should lead directly across the railroad aforesaid to reach high
er ground, whence it could be extended to accommodate
the residents in the immediate neighborhood and be of
use in future development of Shryock Run Country
and whereas the bridge would meet the aforesaid re-
quirements if located where formerly kept up, Now therefore;
we are of opinion that a bridge should be built immediately
below the old Langdon Mill, that the cost of building the
same is more than it is reasonable the Township of Burn-
side should bear, and that the County of Clearfield should
build the said bridge, which bridge is necessary in
our opinion for a public Bridge. A plot or draft
showing the location of the proposed bridge
is herewith annexed. Witness our hands this



Your petitioners respectfully represent that a bridge is very much needed over the Susquehanna River, at a point a short distance above the breast of the old dam, formerly the property of George Patchin, in Burnside Township, said county.

For many years a bridge has been maintained immediately below the breast of said dam, partly by the township and partly by public spirited individuals. The building and keeping in repair of this bridge in this manner has always been quite burdensome.

Petitions for a county bridge at this place, for some unaccountable reason, have been uniformly ignored.

Your petitioners believe the fact that three fourths of all the travel between Patchinville and Cherrytree passed over this bridge, when ^{it was} in repair, is sufficient evidence of the necessity of a county bridge at this point.

And your petitioners further represent that on account of the opening of coal mines, the building of railroads, new homes, and other improvements, and the great increase in

the amount of travel passing this place,
will, in their judgment, make a county
bridge at this point a prime necessity.
