At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 5 day of Oct, A. D. 1905, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Covington, in said county, setting forth that

a Township road, has long since been laid out leading from Mulsenburg to D. Guenot; that a portion of said road from Mulsenburg School House to Dominie Guenot Cross Roads, is very steep and hard to keep up and a new road can be obtained at a much better grade which will be a benefit to the township and the traveling public generally. we therefore pray your Honor to view vacate & supply that portion of the above road and we will ever pray

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view Vacate & supply the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint H. A. Reese Peter Brown, Freeman Shope who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View Vacate & supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
