

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26 day of January, A. D. 1906, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Ferguson, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from Termonor to La Joice at or near the residence of C. J. Shoff to a Public Road leading from La Joice to Bellatuning at or near the residence of James Oaks.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to May Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. B. Alexander, Blake McCracken, H. D. McKeon who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the undersigned Viewers for public road herein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County, to the Supervisors of Ferguson Twp., and notices were posted in the vicinity of the view. Copies of notices with signatures accepting service are herewith attached

On April the 24th. A.D. 1906 as per notices given your Viewers met as appointed and being severally affirmed proceeded to receive testimony and to view for public road as herein mentioned.

Your viewers have found the grades along the route proposed for this public road to be excessive and to exceed that required by law. These grades could not be overcome without greater expense than we believe is justifiable and that Ferguson Township would be willing to bear.

Your Viewers do not therefore feel justified in recommending a public road.
