day of June, A. D. 1906, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

, in said county, setting forth that your petitioners are under great inconvenience for want of a road or public highway to lead from off a point in the public road leading from West Clymer to Peale Pa., or or near ^{the} the Wm Kramer Store North to intersect with the public road leading from Cooper Settlement to Maraville or or near old Maraville Mine.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, report to next term, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. B. Alexander, G. Goss and Leander Denning who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and layout agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

We the undersigned Viewers for Public Road herein mentioned, respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said view to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County, to the Supervisors of Cooper Twp. to property owners along route of said view and notices were posted in the vicinity of view. Copies of notices with signatures are herewith attached.

On July 24th. 1906 as per notices given your Viewers met as appointed and being severally affirmed, proceeded to receive testimony and to view for said Public Road.

Your Viewers have found that the proposed road, except for a distance of six hundred and sixty feet lying within a street in the Village of Grass Plat overlaps a view for Public Road already granted by Viewers (See No. I Sept. Sessions 1906). The expense of constructing this 660 feet of road at a reasonable grade will not be excessive. The petition for this road was supported by a large number of signers, and will apparently be a convenience to a number of citizens. No objection was made at place and time of view to granting this road in conjunction with the longer road which overlaps (No. I Sept. Sessions 1906).

Your Viewers would therefore recommend this road as petitioned, Beginning at a point in the Public Road leading from Clymer to Peale at or near the William Kramer Store, Leading thence N. 4-30 E. 660' on Street to a point in Clearfield street and thence by same courses and distances as view No. I Sept. Sessions 1906. Viz. S.85-30 E. 1310' to a point, Thence S.71-00 E. 443' to a point, Thence S. 73-00 E. 292' to a point; Thence S.78-10 E. 313' to a point; Thence S.71-00 E. 451' to intersect with Public Road leading from Cooper Settlement to Moravia at or near the Moravian Mines.

A map of this road is herewith attached and made a part of this report.

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road. Also, Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by them.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
