At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of Dec., A. D. 1906, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Girard

, in said county, setting forth that

about 35 years ago, a road was laid out without any view, the same leading from Humphrey's Steam Mill to a point on a public road at or near the Old Buck Run School House, that said road, by reason of its having been worked on by the supervisors, and used by the public has become a public highway, that the same now is useless and burdensome to keep up, and that a better road can be obtained that what the present road is. They therefore pray your Honor Court to appoint viewers to view and locate that portion of the above road from the Old Buck Run School House to a point at or near the fields of Serdon Royer

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~Locate and Supply~~ the same according to law, Report to May Term wherupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reece, August Rougeau, Ed. L. Shirey who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View

~~Locate and Supply~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Also—Reviewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.


Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
