CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of March A. D. 1864 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from Peter Braxton's

new mill to cross cut Pike near the line between James and Peter Braxton's land.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Cuttle, James H. Tressler, Charles Sloane

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

The undersigned messrs appointed by the order of Court, hereto  
assisted respectfully report, that in obedience to the said order, they went upon  
the ground, and having examined the ground proposed for said road, proceeded to lay  
out the following road, commencing at the Crop-cut or Union Turnpike.

Hence North  $27^{\circ}$  West, seventeen perches to a White Oak.

" North  $30^{\circ}$  West twenty perches to a White Oak

" North  $29^{\circ}$  West four perches to a White Oak

" North  $31^{\circ}$  West fifteen perches to a White Pine

" North  $42^{\circ}$  West five perches to a Red Oak sapling


" North  $60^{\circ}$  West six perches to a White Oak

" North  $55^{\circ}$  West ten perches to a Hemlock

North  $65^{\circ}$  West twenty three perches to head of by-way on line of land

length and very laid out through unimproved land




Exception:
