At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3 day of June, A. D. 1907, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bonside

, in said county, setting forth that a public road leading from the south end of the upper iron bridge in Bonside Boro to a point at or near the east end of the iron bridge spanning the Susquehanna River at Slabtown is unsafe and dangerous to travel and is flooded during high water. It is respectfully petitioned that a new road be viewed and located beginning at a point on Main St. in the Norley addition of Bonside to a point at or near the east end of said iron bridge at Slabtown

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~vacate~~ <sup>to vacate</sup> supply the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McGeary, B. Blamire & John Connor who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~vacate~~ <sup>to vacate</sup> supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of sealed land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Burnside, Pa. We the undersigned Viewers appointed by Your Honorable Court, No 5 - Sept Sessions 1907. Having served and posted legal notice, met on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1907, and being affirmed according to Act of Assembly, proceeded to view the proposed location for new Road as well as the road to be vacated. We unanimously find as follows. The "River Road" from South Bridge in Burnside Boro being for the most part only a few feet above the low water line, overflows at high water, is hard to keep up, and as will be shown by accompanying notes a very circuitous route between the designated points, and is not necessary as an outlet for any citizens of the Township. We further find that by supplying a road conforming to the accompanied notes and draft, the distance can be very materially shortened, better ground found for a road, which when made will be much less expensive to maintain, and with the exception of a short distance at the point where survey crosses the Boro line, a very easy grade, not exceeding 2 degrees, and at the said point can be made fairly good grade by cutting through the point for about 100 feet. We therefore heartily recommend the change as shown by draft attached which is a part of this report. Notes of survey  
For Vacating - Beginning point "B" in draft thence following the River Road the several courses and distances given on draft which is a part of this report: 3132' to Boro line, 6106' to sawmill run bridge, a total of 8331' to point "C", intersection of new survey. Also recommending for location the part of "Harmony Road" from point near sawmill run bridge to intersection of new survey, about 500'. Supplying as follows - Starting at Upper River Bridge in Burnside Boro, South and, thence along Main St, Notley addition, South 986 feet to Boro line, thence still south, along line of Dr. Gregg, through Notley land, South 583', thence through land of A. McCallough by various courses and distances 1609.7' to Notley line. ~~thence~~ (to Harmony Road) Road to sawmill run 300', and still along base of hill to point "C" a total distance from "B" to "C" of 5631'; from "B" to "C" 4645' in Burnside Boro. No damage asked, but owing to the young timber that must be cut on Notley property we award to owners of same \$20<sup>00</sup> damage. Respectfully submitted,

To the Honorable Allison D. Smith, Judge of the several Courts of Clearfield County.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by Your Honor to review, for the sole purpose of assessing damage to the property of J.W. McCullough, by reason of the construction of a road through same, as laid out under accompanying order, met in accordance with notices duly served, and being severally affirmed, inquired into same.

We find that your former viewers were misinformed as to the location of the boundaries of the McCullough property:-the road occupying about 1600 feet lineal, of same; while the former measurement made only 609.7 feet. We therefore assess to the said J.W. McCullough the sum of \$60.00 which is in our opinion a fair estimate of the damage thereto accruing by reason of the opening of said road.

Sur Petition of J. W. McCullough to refer back Viewers Report.

OPINION.

The petition of J. W. McCullough was presented June 14th, 1910, setting forth the proceedings in the above stated road in Burnside Township and that said road was, upon due confirmation, subsequently partly opened through the land of the petitioner and that he had suffered damage thereby for which he had received no compensation; that he had no notice of the view or of the proceedings thereunder until after the same had been duly opened within the past year. On presentation of said petition we were under the impression that the petitioner was too late and that he could have no relief under our road law.

For this reason we have held the matter under advisement until the present time.

An examination of the authority in North Union Township road, 150 Pa. 512, and other cases, leads us to the opinion however that there would be nothing fatal to the proceedings in granting the prayer of the petitioner. If his allegation is correct, he should have been notified of the view or should have been awarded damages, whether claimed or not, even if such damages so awarded had been only nominal. It clearly appears, both from the petition and from the papers themselves, that the viewers in this case did not clearly understand their powers and duties in the premises. In all cases where private land is taken for a public purpose there must be a clear setting out of damages incurred by that taking, or the fact that there were no damages or a release obtained for damages. In this

case there is not such a clear finding as to the McCullough property, but simply a statement in the general Report that no damages were claimed as to owners generally and an award to one owner. Had the Viewers in this case awarded even only nominal damages to McCullough, duly confirmed, there could have been no redress. The petitioner, at any rate, does not appear to have had a day in Court and we are of opinion that the Report should go back to them for the single purpose of assessing damages to petitioner.

It also comes to the knowledge of the Court that one of the Viewers, John C. Conner, is deceased. We therefore substitute his son, John B. Conner, for the purposes of this re-view or re-reference. At least ten days notice of the time and place of view should be given to the petitioner or his Counsel.

The following order is therefore made:

Now, July 12th, 1910, within petition presented, read and considered, and thereupon J. S. McCreery, C. B. Payrick and John B. Conner are appointed Viewers and the said Report of the former View is referred back to said Viewers for the single purpose of viewing and assessing damages, if any, accruing to the petitioner, J. W. McCullough, by virtue of the laying out and opening of the said road through the property of the said J. W. McCullough and to make report thereon to the next sessions of the said Court.

age was claimed, and that said road passes through land of  
A. McCullough, but they made no effort to obtain a release  
of damages from your petitioner, although at time of view a  
deed was of record to him for land through which a part of  
the road passes, and A. McCullough named as owner had been  
deceased for several years.

Fifth. The land of your petitioner is greatly damaged  
by the laying out and opening of the road aforesaid for rea-  
sons among others as follows:

1. Said road passes diagonally through the tract, which is a small one, and takes from the owner a large portion of his land.

2. Two extra lines of fence will be needed to enclose the sides of the land next said road.

3. Small pieces or points are left where road passes through which are practically useless to the owner.

4. All the timber on the right of way was destroyed in making said road.

Your petitioner therefore, respectfully requests that the reports of the said viewers be referred back to them for correction and the appraisement of damages sustained by him, in accordance with act of assembly in such case made and provided,


