At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13 day of March, A. D. 1907, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Penns

, in said county, setting forth that

an order issue vacating the following Public Road situated in Penn Twp., Road leading from John Holley to Spencer Hill Road, as the road is never travelled and will cost the said Twp a considerable sum to maintain same as a Road which is a benefit to no one and for the granting of this petition, we will ever pray.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and Vacate the same according to law, Report to May Term whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McCaughy, Jas. A. Dolley and Jas. G. Rafferty who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View and Vacate the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the case, they should return the receipt to the officer.
