TO THE HONORABLE ALLISON O. SMITH, PRESIDENT JUDGE
OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY:

The Petition of the subscribers hereto respectfully
represents:-

That they are inhabitants of the County of *Clearfield*;
that a bridge is much needed over the Meshannon Creek, being the
line of the adjoining Counties of Centre and Clearfield, at the
place where the public highway to Philipsburg crosses the said
creek from the Borough of Chester Hill in the County of Clearfield,
to the Borough of Philipsburg in Centre County. The highway, parts
of which the proposed bridge is to connect, ^{is} ~~being~~ known as Walten
Street in the Borough of Chester Hill and as Maple Street in the
Borough of Philipsburg. That the bridge is required because
of the entire dilapidation of the present structure, and the threat
of the public authorities to close the highway to travel; that
the erection of such bridge will require more expense than it is
reasonable the said Boroughs of Chester Hill and of Philipsburg
should bear.

Your Petitioners, therefore, pray the Court to
appoint proper persons to view the premises, together with the
viewers appointed by the Court of the adjoining County, and to
make such order in the premises as is provided by the Acts of
Assembly in such case made and provided.

We, the undersigned Inspectors appointed by your Honorable Court to inspect, in conjunction with Inspectors from Centre County the inter-County bridge across the Moshannon Creek at Maple Street, in the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County, Pa., do most respectfully offer the following report.

We met upon said bridge on Dec. 1st, A.D. 1908, at ten o'clock A.M. That all of the Inspectors as appointed by your Honorable Court, also those appointed by the Centre County, were present. That after we had all been sworn according to law, we proceeded to inspect said bridge and found as follows, to wit:

FIRST. That the said bridge has been erected and completed ready for use and all of the work has been done in a workmanlike manner.

SECOND. That all of the terms and conditions of the contract and specifications have been complied with except those that have been changed by orders of the Engineer in charge by directions of the commissioners he represents.

THIRD. That it was found necessary by the contractor and the Engineer in charge to dig a foundation for the abutment on the Centre County side three (3) feet deeper than the specifications and contract called for, on account of the condition of the soil, thus requiring fifty six (56) cubic yards of additional concrete work.

FOURTH. That it was found necessary by the contractor and the engineer in charge to dig a foundation for the abutment on the Clearfield County side about ten inches (10) deeper than the contract and specifications called for, thus requiring ten (10) cubic yards of additional concrete work.

FIFTH. That by direction of the engineer in charge representing the County Commissioners of both Counties, the arching was so changed as to require forty six (46) cubic yards of additional concrete work.

SIXTH. That by direction of the engineer in charge, who represents the County Commissioners of both Counties, the surface of the driveway of the said bridge was changed from Macadam to brick. All of the work on the Bridge, as per original contract and specifications, also upon the changes as hereinabove described, is well done and in a workmanlike manner.

All of which report, we have the honor herewith to submit.

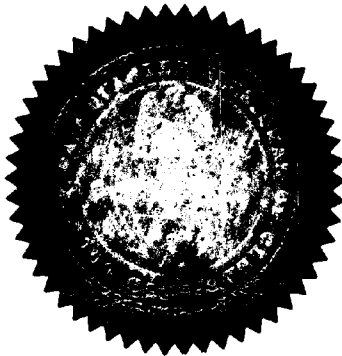

To the Board of Commissioners of Clearfield County.

The report of the Viewers in favor of the rebuilding of the bridge connecting Philipsburg, in Centre County, with Chesterhill, in Clearfield County, on what is known as Walton Street, Chesterhill, and Maple Street, in the Borough of Philipsburg, having been referred to the Grand Jury at February Sessions, 1908, and by them reported favorably, and also they having recommended that the bridge be built of concrete, we hereby approve the action of the Viewers, as also the action of the Grand Jury, as to the necessity of rebuilding the said bridge. We also approve the report of the Grand Jury recommending that the same be built of concrete. The short life of the bridge to be replaced is a sufficient condemnation of the practice of building iron bridges, especially over such streams as the Moshannon, in the water of which sulphur is a constant constituent. I, therefore, as to this bridge, reiterate what I said before to the Board of Commissioners in relation to the bridge in Union Township and the bridge in Beccaria Township, and recommend strongly that this is particularly a proper place for a complete concrete monolithic structure, and I would respectfully ask that the Board of Commissioners, together with the Board of Commissioners of Centre County, secure plans and specifications for such concrete structure so as to arrive at a proper estimate of the cost of the same.

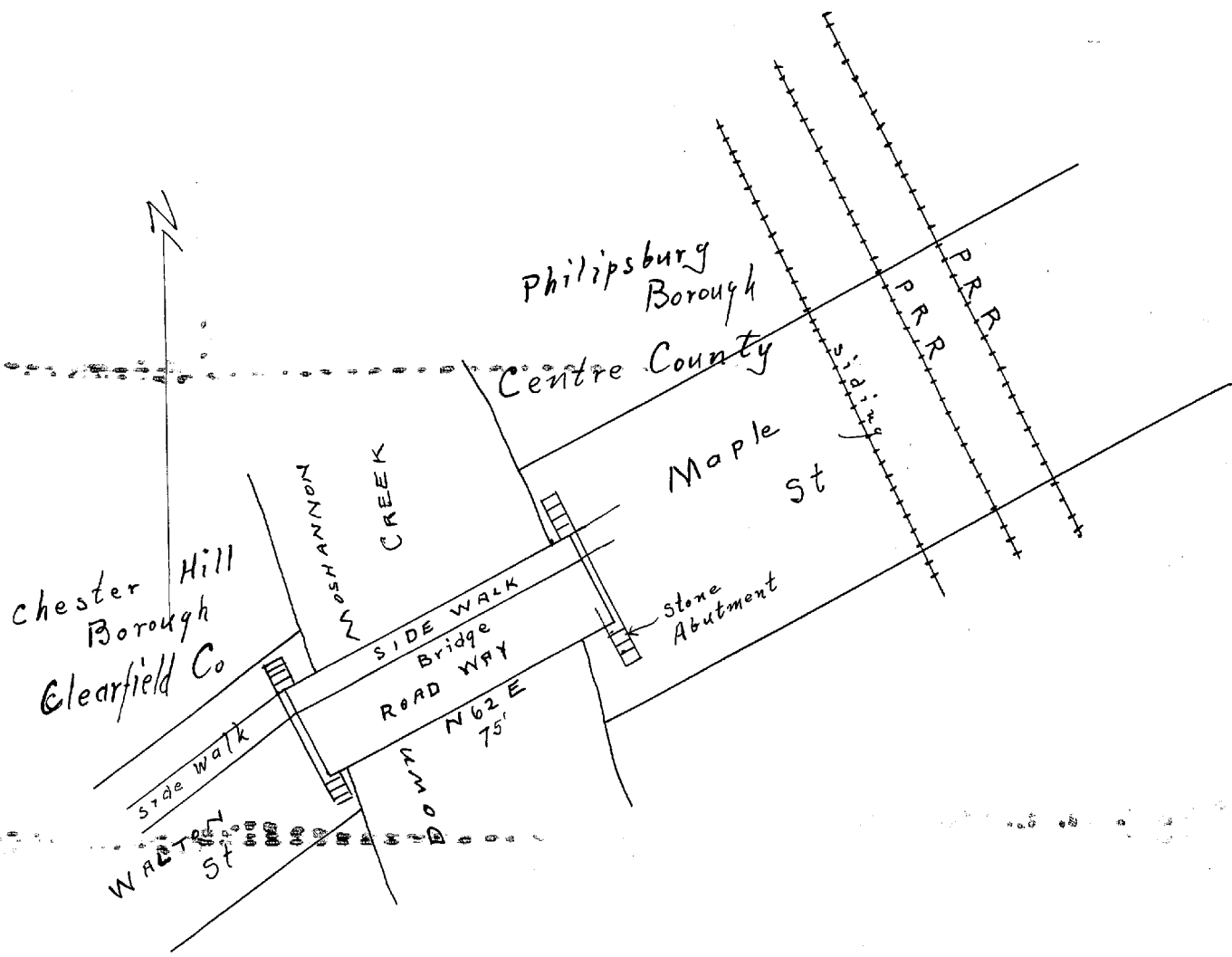

after examining bridge now in use at said
point we are of opinion That the said bridge
is unsafe for travel, and that a new
bridge is necessary there for public
use, being on the main road from
Philipshury to Chester Hill Borough and
Osceola.

We Recommend That a stone or
concrete bridge be built at said point
but if a steel bridge is built it should
be provided for so that it shall be painted
frequently to avoid rusting. Witness
