CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the *23rd* day of *June* A. D. 1864 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Brady* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *The Turnpike*

Road to the home of Allenway Ellinger now owned by Dr. Postelthwaite in said Township of Brady

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Rosel Luther, Surveyor, James Waln & Eli Rishel

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

by the said court to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned report that having been first severally sworn
or affirmed in the manner and form prescribed by the
said order that all of us Roswell Luther Elias Rishel
and James Wall having viewed the ground for the
proposed road did lay out and now return the
same for a Private Road Beginning at the Erie

Turnpike on the Farm of George Ellingers Dec heirs
thence South eighty one & a half degrees West five and
a half perches thru said lands of Ellingers heirs to line
and Lands of Joseph Pastteth formerly owned by Albin
man Ellingers thence Still South eighty one & 1/2 ~~degrees~~
degrees West forty five and a half perches to a plane
tree near said Pastteths house formerly of Ellingers
uplot on draft of which is here unto annexed
and we further appraise the damages of the said Ellingers
Heirs in consequence of the above road running thru
thru the said Heirs land at ten dollars
