That such bridge is necessary and would be too expensive for said Township to build. Your petitioners believing it should be built at the expense of the County pray the Court to appoint viewers to view and report to the Court in the manner provided for in the case of roads.

Now, February Sessions, 1909, the within Report of Viewers, together with the approval or concurrence of the Grand Jury therein, is hereby referred to the County Commissioners of Clearfield County for further action.

We do not concur with the report as a whole. First, as we understand the Report it recommends the building of the entire structure at the expense of the County. We respectfully call the attention of the Board of Commissioners to the practice in this County which has not been to make all bridges of this size County bridges. We think this bridge comes within the class which it has been the practice heretofore to build as appropriation bridges, that is, bridges in which the County furnished the superstructure and the Township the abutments, or some such division of expense. They do not then go on record as County bridges but after erection are turned over to the Districts in which they are located for further and future maintenance.

Neither do we concur in the Report of the Viewers as to the character of the superstructure. As heretofore on several occasions, we protest emphatically against iron bridges for townships or for any other place where some form of concrete structure can be erected. The lightness of the iron put in such bridges and the lack of care which is usually given to them makes their life so short that it is folly to erect them. So also the present cost of plank, which is constantly growing greater, together with the fact that plank lasts but a very few years, in our judgment makes the erection of iron bridges a matter of false economy, if it is economy at all. Even if the first cost of a concrete structure is greater than the first

cost of an iron bridge, it is money well spent. The only thing necessary to see to is that you get a good first class job of re-inforced concrete and they ought to last for hundreds of years and require but little, if any, expense of maintenance. If stone is available and can be used so as to make the cost within reasonable limits, we much prefer it as a material to the iron used.

We, therefore, most respectfully suggest to the Board of Commissioners that they take up with a competent engineer the matter of constructing a permanent re-inforced concrete structure instead of an iron one over Beaver Run, in Burnside Township, and the matter of a division of expenses between the Township and the County can be easily arranged and determined on the line of an estimate of the respective cost of superstructure and abutments proportioned as in the old iron structures.

We concur in the necessity of a public bridge at this point, and also concur in the general recommendation that it is a proper place for the County to aid, but this concurrence is made conditional upon the making of a substantial bridge of stone or cement rather than of iron. We respectfully say to the Board of Commissioners at this time, that we will not approve of any iron superstructures at any point in Clearfield County in which the County is asked to expend any portion of County funds, except it be the large river bridges in which there may be some question as to whether or not a concrete arch can be sprung.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,


whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.



To the Honorable Court of Quarter Sessions
of Clearfield County.

We the undersigned Viewers appointed by
your Honorable Court to view and lay out
a bridge across Beaver Run in Burnside
Twp on the Road leading from Patchinville
to Cherry Tree, Met this 11th day of Nov
1908 as per notices legally served and
posted and having been affirmed
according to law, find that a bridge
at this place is a necessity, and that
the construction of same is more than
said Burnside Twp should be asked to
bear. We therefore unanimously recommend
that an Iron super structure with good
stone abutments be constructed by Clearfield Co.
said bridge to be 44 ft span with 16 ft
roadway 9 ft above low water mark. Con-
forming as nearly as may be followed
by Constructing Engineer to accompanying notes
and draft, the same being a part of this report.
Beginning at a point in center of Road leading from Burnside
Cherry Tree, from Bush mark. (Telephone pole) 5. 74° E. 14.1.
following center line of Road 5. 16° W. (Mag. mer.) 36.6' to face of
North abutment. 44' to face of South abutment. Roadway of
bridge to be 16' ~~as~~ 8' each way from center line, with 9' clear-
ance from low water. Present wooden structure unsafe.
