



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13 day of Feb., A. D. 1908, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of ~~Susan McNaull~~ of the ~~Township~~ of Coalport,

, in said county, setting forth that she is the owner in fee of a farm situate in the twp. of Beccaria, County of Clearfield, State of Pa., that she labors under great inconvenience for want of a private road leading from the buildings on said farm to the public road leading from Coalport to Utahville; that A. L. & W. W. Hagerty are the owners of the surface of the land lying between the farm of the said Susan McNaull and the public road leading from Coalport to Utahville; that she has no practicable way of ingress, egress or regress from the said buildings to the public road leading from Coalport to Utahville. She therefore prays the Court to appoint viewers to lay out a private road from said farm buildings through the land of said A. L. & W. W. Hagerty to a point near a chestnut tree on the public road leading from Coalport to Utahville and make report to Court according to law.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~John B. Jones, Joseph Alexander and James McNaull~~ C. H. May, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view, lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


