To the Honorable Judge of the Court of Quarter Session of the Peace in and for the County of Northumberland
The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of Graham in said County Respectfully Sheweth
That a road has been long since laid out from near Daniel Curley to Susquehanna River and thence down said river to Sandy's ribbon road beginning at or near Daniel Curley, and running along Big run two miles to mouth of said run and thence down along the beach of the Susquehanna river one mile to place known as Sandy.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22 day of Dec, A. D. 1908, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Graham, in said county, setting forth that

A road has long since been laid out from near said Cursley to Susquehanna River and thence back said river to Sandy Creek, which road beginning at or near Cursley's and running along big river, two miles to mouth of said river and thence down along the bank of the Susquehanna River one mile to place of known as Sandy. They find the road has become useless in convenient & burdensome and pray the Court to appoint Viewers to Ascot same

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view Ascot the same according to law. Report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint H. Reese, Peter Mayer, and D. Waring who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to View Ascot agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
