





To the Honorable Allison O. Smith President judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pa. we, the undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of court to view vacate and supply the road therein mentioned, respectfully report, that we gave notice of the said view and met agreeable thereto on the 22nd day of April A.D. 1909 and having been severally sworn or affirmed we viewed the road to be vacated and supplied, and find considerable work done on road asked to be laid out and the same being on ground that will not drift and the road now in use being steep and drifting in winter we have therefore laid out and do return for public use the following road, to wit, Beginning at corner of the land of Grant Sankey, Ira Tate and Harrison straw thence through unimproved woodland of said Harrison Straw N 33 1/4 deg. E 51.5 perches to White Oak Stump, thence by same N 23 deg. E 11.6 perches to post, thence through same N 23 1/4 deg. W 4 perches to Maple Sapling, thence in brushy field of same N 37 deg. W 11.6 to post, thence through brushy field and improved land of same North 26 perches to post, thence through improved lands of same N 12 deg. W 16.2 perches to post, thence through improved lands of same S 89 1/4 deg. W. 27.8 perches to point in public road now in use at wagon Shed of Harrison Straw aforesaid, which road having been laid out, the road now in use between the said points to wit:beginning at the corner of Ira Tate Grant Sankey and Harrison Straw thence N 20 1/4 deg. E, 13.2, pch, N 4 deg. E 5.3 pch, N 43 deg. 10 min. W 18.8 pch, N 33 3/4 deg E. 19 pch, N 16 1/2 deg. E 5.7 pch, N. 8 Deg. W. 10 pch, N 79 deg. W 13.4 pch, N 3 deg E 17.9 pch. N 6 deg. E. 25.6 pch to wagon shed of Harrison Straw aforesaid, has become useless inconveni^ent and should therefore be vacated, the said road laid out being in our opinion necessary for a public road. A draft

of the roads vacated and supplied as aforesaid and showing improvements is hereunto attached.

, in said county, setting forth that

a certain portion of the Public road in said Township, which portion extends from a corner of the lands of Grant Rankin, Ira Tate and Harrison Straw to a point at the wagon shed of Harrison Straw's is by reason of grade and drifts in winter time, an inconvenient road. That it is desired to vacate and supply the said road so as to put the proposed road in a better location. That said proposed change will be entirely upon the lands of Harrison Straw and that he waives all claim for damages by reason thereof.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate and supply the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Ryers, Leander Denning and ~~Frank~~ ^{A. C.} Johnson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view, vacate and supply the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
