IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY.

To the Honorable, the Judge of said Court;

The petition of Robert Addleman, respectfully represents; that he is the owner of a tract of land situate in Pike township, Clearfield, County, Penn'a, adjoining land of ^{and Martha A. Morris} J. R. Morris and the Curwensville Fire Brick Company. The land of said Morris and Curwensville Fire Brick Company lying between the township road leading from Susquehanna Avenue in Curwensville to the Bloomington road in Pike township, and the land of your petitioner. Your petitioner further represents that he has opened a coal mine on his land and that he has no outlet to the public highway for the purpose of hauling said coal to market.

Your petitioner therefor prays your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to lay out a private road of a distance of about thirty rods over the intervening land of J. R. Morris ^{and} ~~Martha A. Morris~~ from the above mentioned public road to the coal bank of said petitioner, with sufficient surface on intervening land or lands, in case the same is necessary, for the turning of wagons and teams and to assess the damages of the same, according to the Act of Assembly of 9th July 1897, and make return of same to next term of Court.





At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22nd day of October, A. D. 1908, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike

~~Robert Johnson~~ is the owner of a tract of land situated in Pike Twp. Clef Co. Pa., adjoining land of J.R. Morris and Martha J. Morris and the Curwenville Brick Co. The land of said J.R. Morris and Curwenville Brick Co. lying between the public road leading from Sugquahua Soc in Curwenville to the Bloomington Road in Pike Twp, and the land of your petitioners, your petitioners further represent that he has opened a coal mine on this land and that he has no outlet to the public highway for the purpose of hauling coal to market. your petitioners therefore pray your honor to appoint viewers to lay out a private road of a distance of about 30 rods over the intervening land of J.R. and Martha Ann Morris from the above mentioned public road to the coal bank of said petitioners, with sufficient surface on intervening land or land in ~~for the same is necessary~~ and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~and lay~~ out the same according to law, ~~and report to next term~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. Merrey, Enos Bloom, Lafayette McElwee who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~view and~~ ~~lay out the same~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a ~~PUBLIC~~ or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
