At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3rd day of May, A. D. 1909, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bigler

^{Township}, in said county, setting forth that a certain public road in Bigler Twp. from a point where the same intersects the township road leading from Amesville to Mader at the Samuel P. Shaff homestead, to a point where the same intersects the Township road from Amesville to Thomas Henderson's has become useless and burdensome upon the top of the top of Bigler Township to keep up and extremely dangerous by reason of the Coal at certain places having been mixed firm beneath the surface thereof and the same being covered in at certain places by reason of the removal of the said Coal, your petitioners, therefore, pray your Honorable Court to appoint Viewers to view, vocate and supply a public Twp. road between the points mentioned.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~vacate and supply~~ the same according to law, ~~and report to next term of Court~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Peter Moyer and Jacob Bunge who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~vacate and supply~~ agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
