

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22 day of Dec, A. D. 1908, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Graham

_____ in said county, setting forth that a road has long since been laid out from Frank Crowels to Susquehanna River, and the said road beginning near Frank Crowels running from there down to the said river a distance of near One mile, your petitioners say it has become useless inconvenient and burdensome, and pray the Court to appoint Viewers to view the same

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate the same according to law, Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese, Peter Moyer and S. H. Waring who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed View and vacate agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


