
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

The condition of this obligation is such that whereas by virtue of the Act of April 4, 1907, we as petitioners do vacate certain roads in Lawrence Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, are obliged to enter into a bond to secure the payment of the fees and mileage of viewers in said petition we do hereby so bind ourselves, but in the event of the confirmation of the report of viewers and payment of costs by the County, this obligation to be null and void.

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARRER SESSIONS OF
CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PA.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the township
of Lawrence in the County aforesaid respectfully represents.

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a
public road in said township, to begin at the West end of Boggs
ford bridge across the river South of Clearfield, and to end at
a point on public road leading from said bridge to Curwensville
about one thousand feet above railroad crossing at Mrs. Espy Spen-
cer's property in said Township. Your petitioners therefore pray
the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to law to
view the ground proposed for such road, and if they see occasion
to lay out the same, to inquire of and vacate the part of the road
now in use from said Boggs Ford bridge along the river to the Smith
house where intersected by the public road leading to McPherson's
mill, which road is burdensome to keep open and in repair being on
low ground and frequently covered by floods and by ice, and will be-
come useless on laying out the road aforesaid. Viewers appointed
lately by your Honorable Court have on two different views made
reports on road between about the same points, which reports were
set aside on technicalities.
